Chet Karwatowski & Anne Marie Johansson's appeal to the Town Board for costs related to a Planning Board Application. They are in the middle of doing a subdivision on their property and some modifications to the previous site plan for their wedding venue. Supervisor Sofranko stated that in our code "Subdivision of Lands" Chapter 133 article IV is the general requirements and design standards for a major subdivision. Under Article IV section 133-21 titled retention of professional consultants and reads as follows: "In the event the Planning Board deems it necessary, it may retain professional consultants to aid said Planning Board in arriving at decisions concerning any particular subdivision. The fee of the professional consultant shall be paid by the subdivider whose subdivision is being reviewed by said professional consultant."

A month or so ago the Town Board approved a motion to allow the Planning Board to hire consultants for this particular application before the Planning Board by this couple. Mr. Karwatowski and Ms. Johansson pointed out in their letter to the Town Board that this is not and has never been considered a major subdivision. It does Not meet the terms and definition of a major subdivision. They stated this is a minor subdivision so they asked the Town Board to waive the requirement that the applicant incur the cost of the professional consultants. Supervisor Sofranko checked with the Town Attorney and he agreed with Mr. Karwatowski and Ms. Johansson position. He said it does not state anything under the next section for minor subdivision about paying for consultants. He suggested that the Town absorb the cost for the legal fees. Supervisor Sofranko spoke with the legal consultant about this and he said it is only going to be a few hours of work. He stated he just has to get the language right to be able to proceed with this application because of the complexity of it and the history.

Bushkill Stream Remediation- NYS Governor's Office for Storm Recovery still had funding available for the remediation and we received \$282,400 for Kingston Equipment Rental, INC. to complete the project.

American Rescue Plan Act- the Town of Olive is eligible to receive \$436,167.00, ½ to be paid this summer and ½ next summer. There is a lengthy eligibility document out there of what projects would be eligible. Some highlights are Broadband, Water & Sewer infrastructure and loss revenues & costs associated with COVID 19. There will more clarity later as we get more information.

NYS DEC Landfill Notice of Violation- The Town of Olive received a notice of violation on June 14, 2021 as a result of an unscheduled inspection of the Transfer Station by the NYS DEC. Supervisor Sofranko has submitted a reply to the DEC acknowledging receiving the violations as they require and shortly after Tim Moot, Brian Burns and supervisor Sofranko met at the Landfill. Tim Moot is from Park, Patterson & Lee and has done our well monitoring

and other remediation on the landfill when we've had problems. They inspected the landfill in the areas noted in the DEC report and have 30 days to reply to the DEC with a written plan of action.

Consolidated Funding Application for a Comprehensive Plan- Supervisor Sofranko is working with Planner Barbara Johnson from LaBella and Environmental Planner Simon Gruber in getting letters of support from various stake holders in the community, Including UC Executive, Olive Planning Board, local businesses and land conservancies to include in our application.

Shokan Waste Water Management Plan-Letters were sent out to all property owners in the designated sewer district asking for property information. Information about the Shokan Waste Water Management Program is available in the Town Clerk's office in West Shokan with the engineering studies and mapping of the sewer district is available both in the Town Clerk's office and during court hours at the Town Hall in Shokan

Committees, Commission, Department Reports:

Cable Franchise Negotiations Committee—Jim Sofranko, Chair

Supervisor Sofranko stated he is in communication with Spectrum on getting some pricing on build out in case the Board decides to use the American Rescue monies for Broadband, which is one of the options. He received a quote for Freeman Avery Road and Chase Road for \$72,340. He will reach out again to get pricing on the whole town.

Parks & Recreation Committee—Scott Kelder, Liaison

The new playground has been installed. Day Camp has started thanks to the Recreation Committee, there is about 48 kids signed up. Due to a collaborative effort with the Library the Birds of Prey show will be on July 15th at 6 pm. The kids will be doing a stream watch program with one of the parents. Other events planned are a pool party and a concert in the park. Softball is going well; tennis courts are complete. Close circuit TV and cameras have been installed at the pool facilities and back of town office buildings

Kingston Equipment Rental was the apparent lowest bidder, the bids were given to SLR Engineering for review and they recommended Kingston Equipment Rental as the lowest bidder. The bid opening was held on July 19, 2021 at 10:00 am.

WHEREAS, the Town of Olive accepted the Local Flood Analysis (LFA) presented by the Flood Advisory Committee on August 8, 2017 and doing so made the Town eligible for funding for structural and non-structural projects to improve flood resilience; and

WHEREAS, the LFA identified the Dry Brook stream crossing at Burgher Road in West Shokan as an area of concern in need of flood mitigation efforts; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2018 the Town Board supported the application to the AWSMP for implementation grant funds for engineering design for the Burgher Road stream crossing.

WHEREAS, the Catskill Watershed Corporation (CWC) Flood Hazard Mitigation Implementation Program (FHMIP) approved the Town of Olive for funding to supplement existing sources of funding for the Burgher Road Crossing project; and

WHEREAS, an Invitation to Bid was advertised on June 25, 2021 with the Town of Olive receiving bids for "Replacement of Burgher Road Culvert over Dry Brook" from 5 contractors by the deadline of 10:00 a.m. on July 19, 2021 and with the bids received, opened, and read aloud at that time at the Town Clerk's Office; and

WHEREAS, all 5 bids for "Replacement of Burgher Road Culvert over Dry Brook" were received and reviewed by SLR Engineering, Landscaping Architecture, and Land Surveying, P.C. and upon completion of their review recommended the town proceed with the lowest bidder of Kingston Equipment Rental, Inc./Baker Brother's Excavating.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, after extensive review the Town, based on best value, approves the bid from Kingston Equipment Rental, Inc. in the amount of \$416,663.75 for the alternate bid as the successful bidder for the application to Catskill Watershed Corporation's (CWC's) Flood Hazard Mitigation Implementation Program (FHMIP) Grant Funding; and empowers the Town Supervisor or Deputy Supervisor to sign a contract with Kingston Equipment Rental, Inc. for the "Replacement of the Burgher Road Crossing."
