Ladies and Gentlemen:

Pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617.6(b)(3)(i) of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act [SEQRA] Regulations, the Ulster County Legislature is circulating herewith the annexed Part 1 SEQRA Short Environmental Assessment Form and Ulster County Legislature, Resolution No. 466 of September 2022 for the above referenced construction of a public safety radio tower and appurtenances to be located at Tonche Mountain – Pitcairn Estates Road in the Town of Olive in the Town of Olive.

The construction of a public service radio tower and associated improvements ("the Project") involves the construction of 110-120 foot radio tower with an equipment shelter, generator fencing and security lighting. Access to the site will utilize an existing road and electrical needs are expected to be met with existing service at the site.

The Project will utilize the current county leased parcel (SBL No. 37.1-5-12.412) that has an 80 ft. tall guyed tower on-site. It is anticipated that the County will be able to extend this guyed structure creating a facility approximately 120 ft. in height and capable of holding the necessary simulcast radio equipment. New anchors are anticipated and the County will repair or replace the existing equipment shelter at the site. Access to the site is extremely limited due to access through a residential courtyard. As currently envision the existing access will be utilized with special construction methods so as to avoid the need for a new access around the existing courtyard. If deemed necessary the County will explore the need for a new access around the courtyard. Disturbance is estimated to be less than 10,000 sq. ft. utilizing the existing access road.

The Project has been classified as an Unlisted Action by the Ulster County Legislature on September 16, 2022 in accordance with 6 NYCRR Part 617.6(a) and the Ulster County Legislature is seeking to establish itself as Lead Agency and conduct a coordinated SEQRA review, which will follow all Type I Action procedures. [6 NYCRR Part 617.6]

The Short Environmental Assessment Form, Part 1, and related documentation is currently being circulated to all Involved and Interested Agencies in order to assist the Legislature in its consideration of the Project as aforesaid.

Involved Agencies include the Town of Olive Town and Planning Boards, and the New York State Department of Homeland Security, New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and the New York City Department of Environmental Protection, as well as required consultation with the New York State Office of Parks and Recreation and Historic

Preservation. The County is seeking to utilize a "Balancing of Public Interests" analytic approach as part of the local municipal land use approval process in recognition of the nature of the use proposed and County's clear governmental interest in the Project.

Coordinated review with all involved and Interested agencies is being undertaken by the Legislature and pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617.6(b)(3)(i) a Lead Agency must be officially determined within thirty (30) calendar days of the date that the annexed materials were transmitted.
